- 011011 The meeting was called to order by Billy Johnson, President of the Board of Trustees.
- 021011 Invocation was given by Penny Riordan.
- 031011 Hear from anyone desiring to address the board.
- 041011 The board heard a report by Mary Parrish on the Texas Primary Reading Inventory (TPRI) for K-2.
- 051011 The board heard a report on Class Reduction (Title II) and Accelerated Reading & Math Initiative K-8 for 2010-2011 presented by Mary Parrish.
- 061011 A motion was made by Kelly Beeler and seconded by Penny Riordan to approve the HISD Employee Handbook as presented. The motion carried. The vote 7-0.
- 051011 A motion was made by Danny Kelton and seconded by Mike Campbell to approve the Campus Improvement Plans and the District Improvement Plan as presented. The motion carried. The vote 7-0.

- 071011 A motion was made by Penny Riordan and seconded by Lanny Evans to approve the FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas) Report as presented. The motion carried. The vote 7-0. Our district received a superior rating.
- 081011 Administration Report of Student Activities and Events:
- 081011.1 Elementary Principal Newsletters listing current and upcoming activities were distributed to board members. Kendra Bennett reported that Grandparents' Day was a success with approximately 450 grandparents in attendance. Mrs. Parrish and Mrs. Pam Payne organized a Pioneer Day which was a big hit. Mrs. Parrish is now planning our Red Ribbon Week along with teaching drug-free lessons. The first round of TPRI testing and benchmarking has been completed. The administrators are meeting with each grade level and looking at the testing data and making plans to reach every student's needs. HES Fall Book Fair was held a couple of weeks ago. Around \$1,350 was raised through generous support from our parents. Mrs. Story, Mrs. Mayes and various parent volunteers did a great job. All third graders received a dictionary

from Atmos Energy and the Clay County Chamber of Commerce. We really appreciate their donation and their time in coming out to visit with the students. HES had a very successful 1st six weeks. Attendance rate is almost 98% with 65% of the students achieving perfect attendance the 1st six weeks. CSCOPE implementation is going well, especially in Science. The students love the hands-on experiments.

081011.2 Middle School Principal – Quana West was not present due to Junior High football games. Newsletters were distributed to board members highlighting campus activities and events.

081011.3 High School Principal – Gary Parrish reported that the first six weeks ran very smoothly. Teachers are preparing 9th graders for the upcoming STAAR test and 10th-12th graders for TAKS testing. High School administration attended STAAR staff Development training at Region 11 in Fort Worth. We will be setting down with each core department and going over each objective to determine what kind of standard they are and teaching those objectives based on level of importance. On October 7th all of the core area teachers attended DMAC training. This training gives teachers the ability to spot weaknesses in a timely manner. At the present time the football team is 3-3 and will be playing Holliday tomorrow night. It appears that there will be some stiff competition for the 2nd and 3rd place spot in district. In volleyball district play we are also at 3-3, playing Holliday on Friday evening before the football game. We hosted a Cross-Country meet a few Saturday's ago. Joyanna Zamzow finished first in the girls' division. The District meet will be held on October 24th in Wichita Falls. On Saturday, October 8th the Henrietta Black Gold Bridgade competed in the Denton Golden Triangle marching Festival and placed 1st in the Class A division and also won best percussion, colorguard, and general effect music in the same division. The Regional Marching contest will be held on October 22nd in Wichita Falls and the Area Marching Contest will be on October 29th. Student Council will be hosting their first blood drive of the year on Monday, November 7th in the Old Gym. Basketball starts on Saturday, October 29th with the girls scrimmaging in Bellevue.
