011016 The meeting was called to order by Paul Bennett, President of the Board of Trustees.

021016 Invocation was given by Billy Johnson.

031016 Hear from anyone desiring to address the board.

041016 A motion was made by Kelly Beeler and seconded by Penny Riordan to ratify Lanny Evans as the designated TASB Official Delegate. The motion carried. The vote 6-0.

0891016 Administration Report of Student Activities and Events:

081016.1 Elementary Principal – Kendra Bennett distributed newsletters to board members highlighting recent and upcoming events. For the 1st Six Weeks, HES recorded the highest attendance rate ever for this time period. Students will be rewarded with an extra recess and teachers will receive a break as the Administrative Team will provide supervision during the extra recess. Half as many discipline referrals compared to last year at this time. Capturing Kids Hearts is working wonderfully and seems to be having positive impact on the students and staff. Accountability results – Met Standard and Distinctions in Academic Achievement in ELA/Reading and Postsecondary Readiness. Over 550 Grandparents joined us for Grandparents' Day. Book Fair was held at the same time and brought in more money than ever before. Once

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again Mrs. Parrish and Mrs. Pam Payne organized the Pioneer Day which was a big hit. There were close to 50 guests that shared with our students. Atmos Energy and the Clay County Chamber of Commerce presented all third graders with free dictionaries. We really appreciate their community support. Students and teachers have begun working on UIL Academics. The 3rd grade musical was last week and was awesome. The 2nd grade musical will be on October 27th at 6:30 p.m. Montague and Goldburg ISD will be visiting our campus tomorrow to learn more about our RTI process and math interventions. Mrs. Parrish will be doing lessons during Red Ribbon Week for K-3 and Serenity House will do lessons for grades 4-5. Staff will be having follow up training for Capturing Kids Hearts.

081016.2 Middle School Principal – Randy Zamzow reported that the Student Council attended a team work and leadership workshop at Camp Chaparral at the end of September. 8th Grade students attended the Career EXPO at the MPEC in Wichita Falls on September 27th. They had a great time and learned many life skills. All grades had a Planner Party where they received planners to record their schedules and homework assignments. HJH Recognized Students for the 1st Six Weeks were as follows: 6th Grade – Kenzlie Hager and Michael Williams; 7th Grade -Grace Holeman and Henley Liggett; 8th Grade - Hadley Craib and Kaden Bost. Mr. Zamzow reported that student athletes are having success in their competitions. Attendance for the 1st Six Weeks was 96.85%. Student passing rate for the 1^{st} Six Weeks is 95.1% for students and 98.6% by classes. Staff have been involved in trainings and meeting. DMAC and TEKS Resource System training. Stephanie Phillips, Professional Service Provider from Region 9 has been working with staff. Campus Intervention Team (CIT) met on September 23rd to discuss Response to Intervention (RTI) plans. An Open House for parents and community members was held on September 27th. At the respective meetings a needs survey was completed by staff, parents and community members. Mr. Zamzow along with Scot Clayton attended an Advancing Improvement of Education (AIE) workshop in in San Antonio. Mrs. Nicki Holbert received training on the School Messenger texting system. Several other trainings have taken place and are in the near future for staff at the campus. The Band Hall construction is ongoing. Interior work is beginning. We are waiting to receive plans for the fire alarm system and permits. Roofing project on the main building has had a few delays, but crew should be on campus next week to complete the project. The security doors for the main building have arrived, but a part is still needed to complete the lock down mechanism. Cross County District Meet will be on Tuesday in Boyd. Football has three games remaining and Volleyball will finish up on October 17th. District "A" Tournament will be October 22nd at City View. The National Junior Honor Society Induction ceremony will be on Monday, October 24th. The Annual Harvest Moon Ball will be on Tuesday, October 25th.
