010319 The meeting was called to order by Lanny Evans, President of the Board of Trustees.

020319 The invocation was given by Betty Ellsworth.

030319 There was no one desiring to address the board.

040319 Jackie Smiley, Kaye McCormack, Shae Price, Kelisha Ervin and Laurie Schaffner were recognized as the Shining Stars for March.

HHS students Caleb Ashley, Holice Holbert, and Shelli Mayes were introduced to the board. They are the members of the TACS Academic Challenge team. They recently attended a meet in Holliday where they placed 1<sup>st</sup> and qualified for State in April. This is the first time Henrietta High School has competed in this type of academic meet.

050319 Technology report was presented by Derek Leach.

060319 A motion was made by Penny Riordan and seconded by Betty Ellsworth to approve the School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) Report as presented. The motion carried. The vote 7-0.

070319 Administration Report of Student Activities and Events

070319.1 Elementary Principal - Kendra Bennett reported that today was World Down Syndrome Awareness Day and that students participated by wearing mismatched socks. The first round of STAAR tests will kick-off on April 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> with the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math and Reading and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Writing tests. The STAAR pep rally will be held on Friday, April 5<sup>th</sup> in the auditorium. The theme for the pep rally is going to be "Imagine the Possibilities" with a Disney flair. STAAR Benchmark testing for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade will be on March 25<sup>th</sup> and March 26<sup>th</sup>. Epilepsy Awareness Day will be celebrated on March 26<sup>th</sup>. Students are encouraged to wear purple. World Autism Awareness Day is on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and students are encouraged to wear blue on this day. The 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Health Fair will be held on April 25<sup>th</sup>. HES Field Day is coming up on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

Mrs. Bennett also thanked the board for its support and assistance during the last few weeks after the loss of an elementary student.

070319.2 Middle School Principal – Terry McCutchen informed the board that current enrollment at the Junior High is 192 and the current attendance rate is 95.46%. Mrs. Browning's classes made birthday cards for World War II veteran Joe Cuba who turned 100. Several junior high students participated in the Texoma Community Credit Union Art Contest at the Home and Garden Festival in Wichita Falls. Ramsey Hensley was awarded "Honorable Mention, 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade" for the copper bracelet that he submitted. This was a great honor, as he was in competition with students through the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders participated in the Jacksboro track meet on Monday, March 18<sup>th</sup>. Several of the athletes placed during this meet. The 2019-2020 cheerleaders have been announced. The 8<sup>th</sup> graders will tour the high school on March 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am, and there will be a parent meeting for incoming freshman that evening in the High School media center at 6:00 pm. STAAR testing for 8<sup>th</sup> grade reading and math will be on April 9<sup>th</sup> and April 10<sup>th</sup>. The 5<sup>th</sup> graders will tour the Junior High on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Final rounds of STAAR testing will be on May 13<sup>th</sup> through May 16<sup>th</sup>.

070319.3 High School Principal – Michael Smiley reported on current and upcoming events. The UIL One Act Play is a Bi-District Qualifier. This is the first time in 16 years that Henrietta has advanced. The Bi-District contest will be on March 22<sup>nd</sup> in Graham. UIL Solo and Ensemble groups qualified for state and Winterguard placed 3<sup>rd</sup> at the competition in Boswell. The Winterguard championships contest will be held at The Colony High School on March 23rd. The TACS Academic Challenge team placed 1<sup>st</sup> at their meet in Holliday and have qualified for the State meet on April 7<sup>th</sup> in Belton. The Student Council was awarded a banner and named state 3A Champions for having submitted 93 units of blood during their 2017-2018 Blood Drive. The STUCO Spring Blood Drive will be March 27<sup>th</sup>. Several FFA CDE contests will take place in March and April. A meeting concerning Vernon Dual Credit and new student orientation will be held in the High School cafeteria on March 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm. An incoming Freshman parent information meeting will be held at 6:00 pm on March 26<sup>th</sup>. The UIL District Academic Meet is scheduled for March 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> at MSU. The UIL Band Concert and Sight-Reading contest will kick off with a community concert at 6:00 pm on April 1<sup>st</sup> and the contest on April 3<sup>rd</sup> at Tarleton State University. Prom will be April 6<sup>th</sup> at Sikes Lake in Wichita Falls. A "Welcome to the Real World" program which is provided by Clay County 4-H will be presented to the seniors on April 30<sup>th</sup>. End of year banquets have been scheduled. The Band Banquet will be May 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Athletic Banquet will be May 5<sup>th</sup>, and the FFA Banquet will be May 7<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Smiley also discussed the CTE Dual Credit courses being offered through Texas State Technical College.

Athletic Director – Byron West informed the board that we hosted several basketball playoff games. Track season is underway and so far the Junior High has competed in the Jacksboro and Henrietta meets. The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls placed 1<sup>st</sup> at the Henrietta meet. We do not yet have the results of the Jacksboro meet. High School track has competed in Henrietta, Nocona, and Jacksboro. Some of the track members also competed in the PK Relays over spring break. Travis Swenson and Tate Sizemore competed in the regional powerlifting meet at Saginaw on March 6<sup>th</sup>. The golf teams have competed at River Creek and Champions in Wichita Falls, and at Stoney Ridge in Childress. Tennis has played at Bowie and Wichita Falls. The new tennis windscreens have been installed on the

courts. Varsity Baseball (5-8-1) and JV Baseball (1-3) have had several scrimmages and played in a few tournaments. District will begin on Friday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>. Varsity softball currently has a record 11-9. They are 1-0 in district. JV softball is 10-2 for the year and they are also 1-0 in district. Kylee Erickson and Addison Hoff signed this evening to play softball for Pratt Community College. Tate Sizemore has been selected to play in the Oil Bowl, and Mason Marchman has been selected to play in the Greenbelt Bowl.
